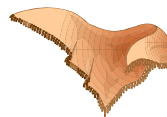


PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY is an ongoing effort.

Dear Friends,

By now I trust that you have received the email letter announcing Berkley's resignation. I can appreciate the difficulty at this time and I can imagine everyone is experiencing a whole host of emotions - myself included. I have received several emails and phone calls over the past 24 hours expressing a variety of concerns, thoughts, and offers of support and I want you to know how much I appreciate all of it. I also want to respond to some of what's happened in the past day.

First off, I understand there was a mistake in the initial email whereby some of you received it and some of you did not. That email went out to the incorrect list on our program, which did not include everybody. This was an oversight and I do offer my apologies for the confusion it caused. Please know that this is a difficult time for all of us, and occasionally mistakes are made. This does not mean they're not important - they are - but please offer us your forgiveness as we adjust and address them.

Second, several people have expressed to me how they find it difficult to come to Church right now. I can certainly understand your anger and frustration. You are entitled to them. If I can, I would like to offer some observations and suggestions. One of the ways our current difficulty has manifested itself recently is through distance and cut-off. Quite frankly, some of us have given up on speaking to others. While that may alleviate the short-term stress, the conflicted relationships remain, and can continue to cause problems. It's like having a defective light bulb in your lamp, and solving the problem by turning off the switch. You're still going to stumble around in the dark.

At the same time, I don't want anyone feeling compelled to come to something if they feel like they're going to be overwhelmed or emotionally hijacked. So please let me offer these suggestions. First and foremost, monitor how you're feeling. On a scale of 1-10, with 1 being the most calm you've ever felt, and 10 being ready to explode, try to engage in activities that keep you at least below a 6 or 7. That may mean taking a break from the 10:30 service for a while. If that's the case, consider some of the other offerings. There is an 8:00 service on Sundays - There's also a 12:15 on Wednesdays and a 7:00 a.m. on Thursdays. The single greatest person we need right now is Jesus Christ, and He is present in a very special way at each and every Eucharist. So please continue to come to at least one service per week, even if it's a smaller one you don't usually attend.

Finally, many have offered their support and asked what they can do during this time. The single greatest thing you can do right now is to love each other - especially the folks you may be upset with. Write a note, send a birthday card, do something to communicate that you care. There is a reason why our Lord said that the second greatest commandment is to love your neighbor as yourself (Leviticus 19:18). Go ahead and use the same scale outlined above to monitor how much you're able to do, but definitely stay connected. We are going to move forward from this, and the only way we're going to do that is together.

I am truly sorry that things have come to this. The loss of our Rector is a difficult time in our family. Please know that I love you all, and will be available to talk should you need to.

The Great American Clean-up--Keep Norfolk Beautiful Day -- Saturday, March 27th, 9:00 am to noon

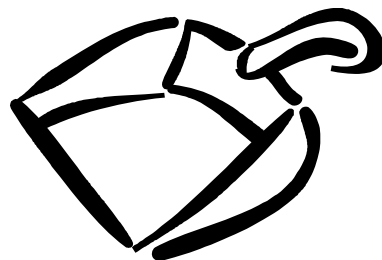

NEW FOYER GROUPS BEGIN IN MAY

Participation in Foyer Groups is a wonderful way to meet fellow Christ & St. Luke’s parishioners. (The term “foyer” is French for fireplace and comes from the Latin, meaning hearth, implying warmth and pleasure.) The current cycle of Foyer Groups will end in March; a new cycle will begin in May and continue through September. Approximately 70 parishioners are taking part in the current cycle, which began last October.

Foyer Groups are made up of 10-12 adults of different ages and length of time at Christ & St. Luke’s. Each group meets once a month for five months for a simple meal in the homes of group members or in a restaurant, though not every member need host a meeting. Most groups meet in the evening; during the first cycle one group is meeting for lunch. There is no program or agenda; these are informal social gatherings that meet enough times for the members to get to know one another. Current members who wish to continue to participate in a foyer group will be “shuffled” and assigned to new groups. Parishioners who have not participated in a foyer group (including adults new to the parish) are invited to sign up for the upcoming cycle. Parishioners who participate in a Foyer Group over time will realize a different Sunday church experience as they know more and more of their fellow parishioners.
